

**CA Association of Local Behavioral Health Boards & Commissions (CALBHB/C)
Governing Board Meeting (Zoom Conference Call)
May 29, 2020 Minutes**

The meeting was called to order at 11:30 am by President Harriette Stevens, Ed.D.

Introductions: New members, Shera Banbury (Nevada County), Patrick Ogawa (Los Angeles County) and Bill Stewart (San Diego County) were welcomed, followed by short introductions of all members. Short bios at: www.calbhbc.org/contact-us .

Minutes: Jerry Harris made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 17, 2020 meeting. Supervisor Fenley seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Finances: Comstock presented the “Statement of Financial Position” and “Statement of Activity,”, commenting:

- 1) Total Equity as of May 22, 2020 was: \$137,587.70.
- 2) Expenses are lower than anticipated due to elimination of travel (due to COVID-19), and elimination of the part-time assistant position.
- 3) Revenues for fiscal year 2020-21 are likely to be lower due to COVID-19’s impact on local and state tax revenue. FY 2020-21 budget will be on the agenda next month.

A motion to accept the financial reports as presented was made by Vice President Benavidez with a second by Stacy Dagleish. The motion carried unanimously.

The minutes and financials were sent electronically to Governing Board members prior to the meeting.

Impact of COVID-19 (Discussion): Governing Board Members discussed local impact of COVID-19 in their communities.

Issues shared:

- Access to technology/telecommunication devices and internet
 - For telehealth and counseling - Digital divide prevents some individuals from accessing services/programs.
 - Increased cost to providers
- Budget impacts to community-based organizations (layoffs, furloughs, pink slips)
- Board & Cares for individuals with Serious Mental Illness:
 - Some individuals come and go, not adhering to quarantine / shelter-in-place COVID-19 safety precautions.
 - Increased costs without increased funding
 - Lack of PPE
- Increase in suicide attempts (Napa)
- Increase in Substance Use Disorder (Nevada County)
- Access to Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) (Ventura County)
- Peer Support Day Center Closed (Nevada County)
- County challenged by COVID-19 outbreak, closing departments twice (except for essential workers) (Alpine County)

Successes Shared:

- Housing: Thousands of individuals experiencing homelessness have been housed through Project RoomKey, with Behavioral Health agencies providing supportive services.
- Telehealth: People are keeping their appointments (much fewer “No-Shows”)

3. Advocacy Update:
 - a. [5/22 BH Safety Net Letter](#) was unanimously supported by the Governing Board
 - b. [SB 855](#) - Health coverage: mental health or substance abuse disorders : Senate Appropriations Hearing scheduled for 6/1. This will likely be put on “suspense”.
 - c. [AB 2668](#) - Integrated School-Based Services: this bill was pulled by sponsor CBHDA.
 - d. [AB2589](#) - No Place Like Home funding for B&Cs - in committee process (no dates)
