Proposition 1: March 2024 Ballot

A major behavioral health initiative will be on California's March 2024 ballot in the form of Proposition 1.

Proposition 1 includes:

- 1. <u>Behavioral Health Infrastructure Bond</u> <u>Act</u>: \$6.38 Billion Bond
- <u>Behavioral Health Services Act</u>: Updates to the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) to become the "Behavioral Health Services Act" (BHSA)

CYBHI Round 3: EBP/CDEP Early Childhood Wrap-Around Grant Funding Application: As part of the Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI), the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) seeks proposals from individuals, organizations, and agencies to scale early childhood wraparound services to support relevant skill building among adults who work with infants and young children and expectant and new parents and caregivers. Funding in this round will focus on home-visiting services and select practice components of consultation services. Updated due date: November 1, 2023, 5 pm

CYBHI Round 5: Early Intervention Programs and Practices Request for Application: To scale early intervention programs and practices that provide mental health and wellness services to children, youth, parents, and caregivers in California with a specific focus on children and youth from African Americans, Asians and Pacific Islanders. academic training grants to be administered by colleges and universities with under- graduate and graduate programs in the field of rehabilitation. Grantees must direct at least 65 percent of their total project costs to trainee scholarships.
