Subject: AB 738 Community mental health services: mental health boards – Request for Veto

Dear Governor Newsom,

The Governing Board of the California Association of Local Behavioral Health Boards & Commissions (CALBHB/C) is opposed to AB 738.

Adding the veteran/veterans advocate membership requirement creates the precedent for adding other sector-based requirements (sectors that are equally important.)

Additional complexity can stymy boards and is unneeded since <u>WIC 5604.2</u> (Duty #4) <u>already specifies</u> that the mental health board shall: "Review and approve the procedures used to ensure citizen and professional involvement at all stages of the planning process. Involvement shall include individuals with lived experience of mental illness and their families, community members, advocacy organizations, and mental health professionals. It shall also include other professionals that interact with individuals living with mental illnesses on a daily basis, such as education, emergency services, employment, health care, housing, law enforcement, local business owners, social services, seniors, transportation, and <u>veterans</u>."

In support of CA's 59 local mental/behavioral health boards who already must comply with pages of requirements (attached), we ask you to veto AB 738.
